I had no doubts to place this masterpiece on the top.

Three-phase carousel theme with cycle of double threats.

Threats of these phases appear in set-play as mates after thematic defences. All keys are played to the same square – which is a flight, btw.

Additional try with double Dombrovskis paradoxon.

Besides the set-play (which could not be thematic by the definition), all variations in all other phases are thematic.

Perfect balance between difficulty of the theme, number of thematic elements and aesthetic impression!

is announced for any kind of problems in 2 moves with antagonistic stipulation (#2, =2, S#2, R=2, etc...). Twins, multiple solutions, promoted pieces and also all kinds of fairy pieces and/or conditions are allowed.

The following **theme** is required:


The **1st W move** (try or key) and the **1st B move** (defence or refutation) are played onto **neighbouring squares**.

Multiple phases and changed mates are welcome, but not mandatory.
